




## Teaching Observation Program (TOP)

- Are you curious about how others perceive your teaching? Would you like specific, constructive feedback from a peer, in areas you specify?
- Peer feedback is a valued way to improve teaching and learning at UCSF.
- The philosophy of TOP is to focus on what an individual identifies as a need in their teaching.
- TOP observers have been trained to do observations of large group, small group, clinical and surgical teaching, and to give structured peer feedback, in writing.
